But praise God, the Spirit of Christ in him is giving him boldness like that of the Apostle Paul. God can raise up critically important people for His purposes, and often they are the ones who have walked away from the hate and violence of false religion. 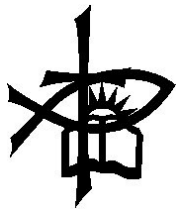
R THE MOST HORRIBLE THING

"It's the most horrible thing," said the bank manager to another customer. I was nearby and not eavesdropping but waiting for my turn to sympathize with her. The word had gotten around that her daughter had died suddenly, and bank customers were trying to show their love.

As we had frank spiritual discussions through the years about our struggles to help our wayward child find stability, she knew I was a safe person to share her question of God. She came out with it directly, lamenting that after all the struggle, the years of trying to get her daughter on the right track and free from addiction, it had happened! Her daughter recently

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was in her right mind and the relationship became better. Now, she had found her daughter dead in her apartment. Questions swirled in the mother's mind, but chiefly this one; after all the effort, the pain, the struggle to help her daughter find wholeness, why would the Lord take her so soon after recovery? Was there to be no period of joy and togetherness?

My answer was simple, that her daughter was ready. She was not ready previously, and had the young woman died in a state of rebellion or addiction the pain of loss would have been far more intense. As her daughter died addiction-free and in a better relationship with her parents, the major issues were resolved. She was in faith and ready to die. In the light of eternity, it was critical that her daughter died mentally and spiritually whole but not critical to have additional time with loved ones here.

Death is nearly the most horrible thing, but there is one thing worse, knowing someone died without Christ. That is truly hopeless. It is critical for our loved ones that they know we died in firm faith in Jesus. Please do not leave them hanging, hoping. Make sure they know you love the Lord and are pursuing becoming a better follower of Christ. That means more than just saying it. It means living your faith in the disciplines of the faith (worship, learning the Word, prayer, and serving in some form by using your gifts/abilities). It is one of the biggest gifts you can give to your family and friends! When someone is new in faith or just recommitting themselves, they don't have a long track record of works, but that is ok. Commitment shows over time.

The bank manager is enduring the sting of death (see I Corinthians chapter 15), the visceral pain of the loss of a loved one. I lovingly reminded her of Pastor Paul's reset statement at such a time, "We do not have a crisis. A crisis is entering eternity without Jesus." The bank manager and I will talk, and she will heal because she knows her daughter was a follower of Jesus. She is going through the second most horrible thing. But she does not have to endure the most horrible thing.

ARE YOU READY?

The snow has come, the first of the season. Is your snowblower ready and fueled up? Are shovels handy? Is there a snowbrush in your car? Jesus taught his followers to read the signs of the times just as we read the signs of the seasons (see Luke 12:54-56). Some pay attention while others dismiss hints and reminders.

Christ will return. He tells us to be ready, and watchful. We are to be doing what Christians do, not what the world does. We are to be in such a state that when He comes, we are excited and not apprehensive. The snow is a reminder. Are you ready?
