IT'S GREAT TO BE LESS MANIPULATED

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We are all manipulated by big industries and big information across the world. Advertising, junk food, weather fear-mongering, and other influences affect our mental health. A large and growing number of school districts are suing the major media platforms – Facebook, Instagram, YouTube, TikTok, and Snapchat – as "substantially" contributing to a crisis in mental health. These were the school systems that turned a blind eye to what should have been obviously problematic policy of allowing cell phone use in schools. Now that it is a crisis, the schools are looking to ban cell phone use during class time and to blame other entities for the decline in students' mental health.



Is this surprising? Humans in large numbers exhibit high naivety in trusting the government and big business, high addictiveness, low contentment, and low spiritual wisdom. Conservative Christians have been warning of the fallout from the overuse of cell phones and social media for years! In 2024, U.S. Surgeon General Vivek Murthy called for a warning label on social media platforms! In Wisconsin, 34% of high school students had reported feeling so sad or hopeless "almost every day for two weeks in a row" that they had "stopped doing some usual activities". The National Youth Risk Behavior Survey indicated that 18% of high schoolers had contemplated suicide.



We have signs outside of our church with a simple invitation "Need Hope? Join us!" To date, not one family with children has come through our door. Evidently, families in crisis are unaware of the state of their teens, or how to deal with it. Evidently, they don't think attending a church that specifically wants to give them hope is a good solution. Hopefully, it won't take a mass shooting event or a suicide for families to reach out for help, but it appears the general crisis is not enough motivation.

Through years of neglect of proper communication, inconsideration, and letting go of joint activities, they drift away, as they describe. They become separate individuals inhabiting the same space. They are emotionally ripe for an affair, wrongly thinking that they are with the wrong person and that someone else would be right for them. Then the betrayal happens, as though a gun were taken to the relationship. The last nail in the coffin is the divorce. If a couple heading for divorce reaches out for help to a pastor, it is often at the last hour. Like a train weighing hundreds of thousands of pounds and speeding down the track at 70mph with a bridge out in a quarter mile, the doom is all but assured. The couples come to counseling largely at the insistence of one of them; the other is already emotionally checked out. Literally, it is a miracle, an act of God, if the relationship can be saved. If half the relationships are redeemed, it's a good record, given the lateness of the rescue.
