### **ROTHKO IN A CAN**

Dutch curators of the Netherland Museum are trying to determine what steps should be taken after an unsupervised child damaged Grey, Orange and Maroon, No. 8, putting some visible scratches in the unvarnished paint layer. When you pull up an image of the work – please do for entertainment value – you may agree with me that it is not worth its \$56M supposed valuation.

I think the painting should be donated to the Milwaukee Museum. It could be cut up into small pieces and thrown onto the floor – in front of Duane Hanson's Janitor. It could be renamed; Janitor Contemplates Rothko No.8 !

Do not suppose that I have antipathy against fine art! I have deep admiration for the work of the masters such as Michelangelo and have been blessed to see some of the world's finest art pieces. The Sistine Chapel and statues of Moses, David, and the Pieta are stunningly beautiful. Rothko's rectangular blobs of paint that are said to be floating color fields are a tragic outcome of modern man's demented idea of beauty. Conceptually, it belongs in a trash can! How dare I make that assessment! Isn't creativity and individuality to be celebrated above all. No, it is not. Many people have neither skill nor sense, and neither is to be celebrated! Humanity is not elevated by fawning over what is pathetic.
