Do we ever get to the point where we can say with James, the half- brother of Jesus, "Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance" (James 1:2)? Can we grow to adopt a highly mature spiritual attitude like that of Joseph, who considered potentially crushing personal setbacks as stepping stones to greater blessings? For all the hard times his brothers gave him, Joseph took it in stride; his brothers meant to harm him, but God meant it for good (see Genesis ch. 45). How do we get that kind of faith in God without being put through the mill? The short answer is, we don't get that kind of faith unless we are put through the mill! We have a great deal to learn from those who struggled and yet put their hope in God!

STING OF DEATH ILLUSTRATION HAS BEEN HELPFUL

In I Corinthians 15, Paul the Apostle writes, "The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (v.58). It has been several years since I was stung by a bee while riding a motorcycle. I thank God for that experience because it helped me better understand the discussion in that passage about the sting of death. Since then, many have thanked me for the analogy, explaining the pain, frustration, and loss of death as a venomous sting that fades over time. Similarly, our preoccupation with the deceased, emotional suffering, and distraction fades over time. As Christians, these are replaced with anticipation of reunion with those who have died with faith in the Lord, Jesus. We have a merciful Father who heals us, even from the sting of death!

KNOW WHAT YOU ARE HANDLING

The teen who had graduated from high school three days prior attempted to light a firework in his hand. It blew up instantly and took his hand off. Pardon the pun, but the arrogance makes us think we have a handle on things, even while being astoundingly stupid. Hardly a day goes by when several people take unwarranted risks, often in a bid to create a video to impress the world.

Christians are to be fundamentally sound in their thinking. Conservative Christianity is not well respected by contemporary society. However, sincere faith and sensibility team up to bless those who respect wisdom. When I was young, I envied the excitement of the rowdy crowd. But as it violated God's will, I never wanted to be part of it. As I have grown in faith and wisdom, I thank God that I was protected from the "excitement" that harms.
