This Is Our Story Dedicated To The Schroeder Family: The date was September, 2013. Although I do not remember the exact day, I do recall a beautiful warm sunny afternoon with a slight breeze. Harry and I drove our niece to Greendale High School for a dance audition. Rather than wait at the audition, Harry and I decided we would run a few errands. As Harry drove from Greendale High School I noticed a beautiful church, a church I have driven past many times before. However, this particular day I felt the need to stop and take a closer look (I love exploring churches, it is fascinating to me). As we approached the church I was impressed with the unique architectural design of the exterior. I noticed the large concrete sign at the main entrance of the church which reads: "Our Shepherd Lutheran Church."

I was intrigued, So, I suggested we try to see the inside of the church. Honestly, I did not expect to be able to see the interior, because gone are the days to walk into a church at anytime. As we approached the door, I pulled on the handle and to my surprise the door was unsecured. So we walked inside and as we did I felt peace that I had been searching for. Pastor Paul said that he did not have much time, maybe 15 minutes" to give us a tour of the church. He pointed out certain aspects of the architectural structure of the church, I asked him about the (white) light diffusers suspended from the ceiling, Pastor Paul explained the fact that light through the windows. I responded, "They look like dove wings..." He said, "No one has ever said that." He paused looked up at the light diffusers and said, "I guess they do look like dove wings."

After our tour Pastor Paul invited us to sit on one of the couches located in the main lobby of the church. He explained the history of the church to us and talked about his family. He proudly told us about his wife Sylvia, Pastor Doug's wife Connie, as well as his grandsons, Luke and Michael and his daughter Dana and her husband, Don.

An hour later we were still chatting with Pastor Paul, at which time he invited us to attend a church service. He asked if we belonged to a church, we said that we did. He indicated that his intention was not to take us from the church we were members of at the time of our conversation.

Remembering Pastor Paul Schroeder: It was a warm and sunny day in late summer of 2013. I couldn't recall exactly what day; in fact, I had the wrong month entirely. I thought that it was a day in April or May, but that did not add up with the math. A phone call had to be made to confirm the correct date range. It is weird to me that I remember everything else about my first experience with Pastor Paul except for what day that it was. The whole week was beautiful. For a change everything seemed to be going our way, that is for Tina and I, and that hadn't happened for quite some time.

We spent a lot of time that day talking about changing churches. It was important to us that we stay within Missouri Synod, so we were looking hard, and also trying to sever all ties to the previous congregation. We were not happy there anymore. We couldn't even feel the presence of the Lord there. There was no life, and I cannot express how unhappy we were as Christians just feeling trapped in a cycle of the same old, stale services with a never ending list of demands being made upon us, and watching no one else contributing.

Then it changed. Everything changed.

We had been making trips back and forth for a few weekends from the house to Greendale high School to watch our Goddaughter, Christeka Widule, audition for a musical production of American Kids. We would pass by Our Shepherd Lutheran Church several times a day, not really noticing so much because we were not sure of our route and were concentrating on the task at hand and our destination. One of the days we were passing by; it was just before lunchtime, maybe around 10:45am, and I mentioned to Tina that maybe we should check out this church since it was LCMS and closer to the house than where we were attending. Tina agreed and said how much she was impressed by the "Big Jesus Fish" on the side of the building. I had no idea what she was talking about as I never noticed it, but now cannot pass by without seeing it and remembering our encounter that day.

We pulled up to the main entrance underneath the canopy. It was warmer and sunny that day, so we were happy to be able to park in the shade and be able to leave the windows down. The plan was to just stop in for a moment, check out the worship area, and leave for lunch. As we walked up to the doors, I thought how odd that it was that the windows weren't square. We opened the doors and walked in together. As we crossed the threshold, we both released a heavy sigh. I remember the hair on my arms standing on end and a sensation as though my soul was crying out of happiness. We weren't more than three feet in from the door, when we started talking about what we both were feeling; knowing that we were home.

That is when we met Pastor Paul.

He was an stout, older gentleman with a military style, flat-top haircut; not all gray, there was still original color in his hair, and he had an air of military discipline about him. Even though he was obviously seasoned, there was a youthful energy that encompassed him. He had a look on his face that was both inquisitive and investigatory – considering that he was hearing voices that he did not recognize in his church. He asked if there was anything that he could do for us. We plead our case about looking for a new home to worship in, and that we had a "few minutes" to check out and see what this church had to offer. Pastor Paul mentioned that he was working on his Sermon for the weekend's worship, and that he also had a "few minutes" to show us around if we would like a tour of the church.

#### "A few minutes"

Pastor Paul lit up like a prom night school boy. The first thing that he talked about was the absence of right angles and deliberate lack of perfection symbolizing us, as humans never being able to achieve the perfection of Jesus Christ. Then we talked about our histories, our faith, expectations, desires and goals. I asked if he had ever been in the military, based on my first impression of him, and he responded, "No, why do you ask?" He walked us through the Chapel, the Library - with the God's Work Today artifacts, and the recording studio. On the way back to the main building he stopped in the hallway and went through the "Key Chapters of the Bible" framed works one by one. He was so proud of these accomplishments. I could barely keep up with him. The energy

that was portrayed, and the spirit that emanated from him was captivating. Ninety minutes later we left Pastor Paul to his duties and we never went out to lunch.

We found our Christian worship home at Our Shepherd Lutheran Church because of Pastor Paul Schroeder.

Years later I came across Pastor Paul at Pick 'n Save on Cold Spring. I was dressed kind of sloppy since I was just stopping for beer, milk and potato chips – not necessarily in that order. It was in the hot deli section at the southwest corner of the store between produce section and the bakery that I saw him. He looked kind of sad and lost, but that was just my impression at the time, he could have easily have just been stuck deciding what he wanted to have for lunch. I felt that I was in a hurry and tried making an excuse not to say "hi" and get involved in a conversation, but then I remembered how he had a "few minutes" for us a couple of years ago and I could not walk away from him. I said hello to him and I could tell that he did not immediately recognize me; this happens to me all of the time, and we were engaged in conversation – I don't remember the topics – I could tell that he knew who he was talking to. He said that he went to Pick 'n Save for lunch fairly frequently because it was hot, fresh and quiet; but not that day. We talked for over an hour and I am glad that we did; after all, he went out of his way to make a "few minutes" for us that strengthened our faith changed our lives forever.

Over 20 years ago, I checked into the Federal Prison Camp in Duluth, MN. I had been convicted of what we call a white-collar felony and sentenced to 21-24 months at this camp. At this point, the details do not matter, but needless to say, I was devastated.

Pastor Paul had been a strong supporter of mine during the period leading up to my incarceration, with prayers, encouragement, and love. And he promised to visit me on a regular basis.

And that he did!! His first visit was 6 weeks after I arrived at "camp". He talked with me, joked, we laughed, prayed, and he read from the bible and gave me communion. This encouragement was all I needed to hold my head high at the camp and pray to God for help, forgiveness, and support.

Pastor Paul continued his visits on about a 6 week interval, and I believe, I saw him 15 times in all! The only person that visited me more was my faithful wife!!

And this was not easy chore for Pastor Paul. The drive each way was 6 hours plus stops. Many times he made the trip in the same day. He was having leg and hip problems also, which really made the trip difficult. But he never stopped the visits.

Towards the end of my time, I was in the recreation hall waiting for his visit and talking to some other inmates. They asked me who my visitor was today, and I said my Pastor. I told them that he comes to visit me every 6 weeks from Greendale, WI. One inmate said that he tried to get his pastor from Eau Claire, 2-1/2 hours away, but he never would. So this inmate had given up on religion. I told him to hang in there, as he just has to find the right pastor.

So as you see, I was the one that had a pastor that was caring, one that would do most anything to save a soul. And that he did! I can hear Jesus now saying to Pastor Paul: "Well done, thou good and faithful servant! I was in prison and you visited me! For whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers, you did for me.

I truly miss Pastor Paul, but know he is now in heaven and talking with the saints as he always wished he could do. ~ Dan S.

I won't forget my first time going to Our Shepherd. I walked in, sat down, and was concerned because I didn't know if it was a Lutheran church. I grew up a strict WI synod member. I cried that morning in church, I cried on the way home and felt the Holy Spirit burn inside me as I had never before. I couldn't wait to tell Mark all about this church. Mark worked out of state all that summer, and when he came home, I prayed he'd love the church as I did. We have never felt so welcome in a church and a part of a church before this. Mark and I went thru Pastor Paul's classes. He explained the church's beliefs and expectations and compared them to what I was brought up to believe. We joined the chancel committee and attended bible studies. We will not forget our first Easter in church, Pastor Paul comes out to the front as always, pauses and states loudly, JESUS CHRIST.......HAS RISEN with Pastors pause and we were like, what happened. And then he said "has risen" Mark and I were like whew, we thought something happened, and he was upset! Pastor Paul sure knew how to get your attention!!

Pastor Paul counseled us prior to our marriage. I was comfortable with him and felt I could always ask questions with no judgment (I could not do that in the church I grew up in). I asked, "why do I have to say honor and obey in my vows?" and he explained the next few sentences in the Bible of what God requires of Mark. Due to my courage to ask, we got the answer that we both need to understand God's will. Pastor Paul married us, and he didn't just use an old sermon from the past. He really knew us and had a meaningful sermon for our life and guests that attended.

Pastor Paul also baptized Addeline, and then we moved away for a time. We are very thankful we moved back before Pastor Paul retired so we could hear his powerful sermons in person a couple more times. He certainly impacted our lives and taught us many keep points that we take with us today.

Doug, you spoke about giving the sermon at your dad's memorial. If anyone can give a powerful and meaningful sermon, it will be you. You blessed Mark, Mark's entire family, and me when you gave the sermon at Mark's dad's funeral. Mark's family were not churchgoers. You opened their eyes, and I'd like to think because of what you did that day, the Holy Spirit came to them too. The sense of peace and comfort you gave us will never be forgotten; by God's Words, you spoke to us.

Pastor Paul is smiling down on you and your family. You had the best mentor and father a person could pray for, and God gave you the Blessing of preaching together for all those years, which in turn, Blessed Our Shepherd. We attempted, one last time, to visit Pastor Paul and Sylvia that was not meant to be. It was merely one week before Pastor Paul's health deteriorated rapidly and The Lord calling Pastor Paul home – Pastor Paul I am calling you home, your work is finished here on this earth.
